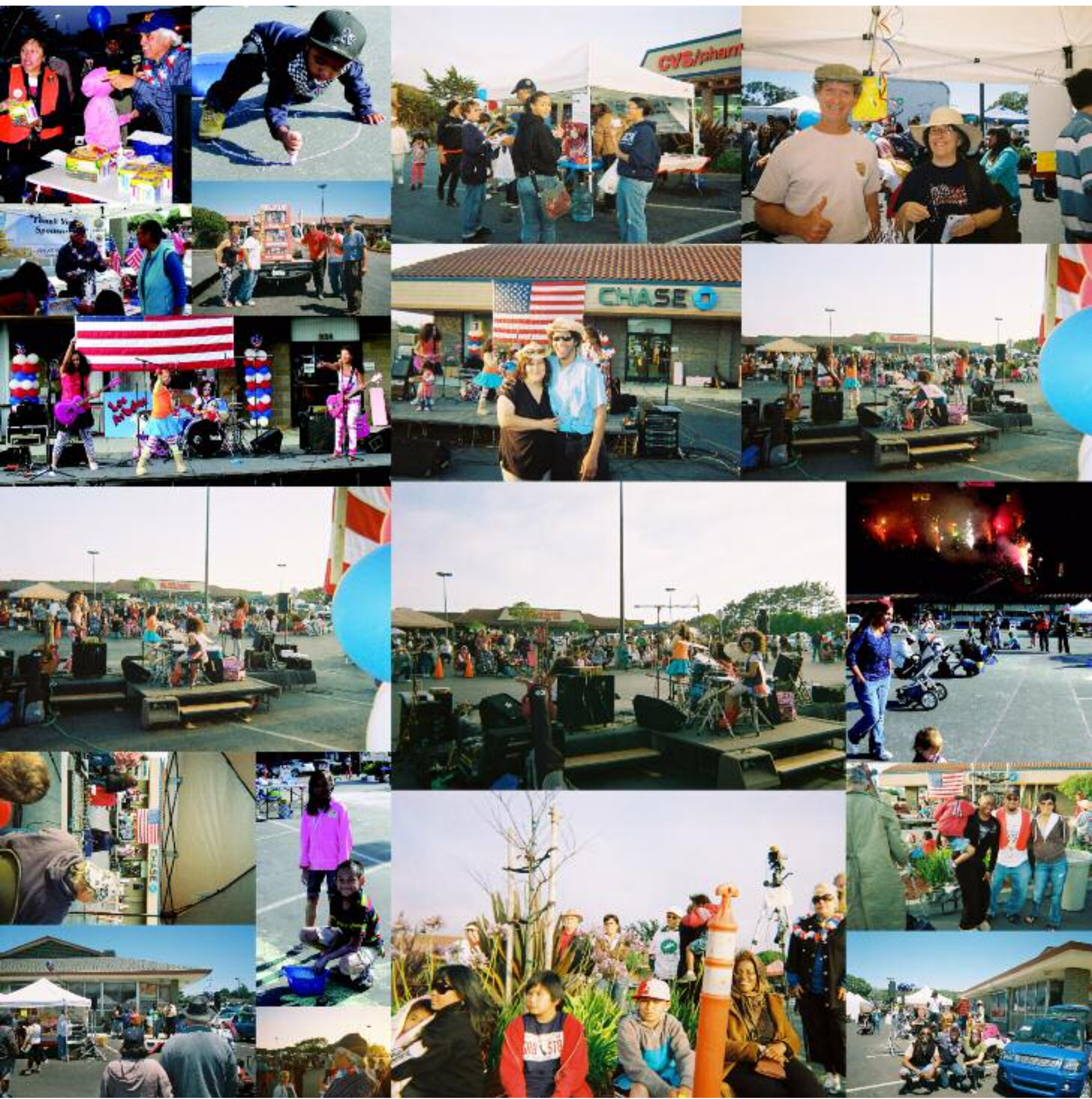


# Marina Fourth Of July Celebration
